

## **Short Resume of Prof. C.A.K. Yesudian**

Dr. C.A.K. Yesudian, Dean, School of Health Systems Studies, did his doctorate in Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) and post-doctorate in Harvard School of Public Health on International Health Policy. He has set-up the Department of Health Services Studies in TISS and developed postgraduate degree programmes in the fields of hospital administration and health administration.

Dr. Yesudian was Takemi Fellow on International Health Policy at the Harvard School of Public Health and was also Career Development Fellow of the World Bank. He was the recipient of the Health Research for Development award of the Rockefeller Foundation and was awarded by the Princess of Thailand in Bangkok in the year 2000.

Dr. Yesudian was interim Manager (2005 – 2006) of Alliance for Health Policy and Systems Research of WHO in Geneva. He also worked with the WHO Kobe Centre in Japan in 1998 and 1999 in the field of aging and health.

Dr. Yesudian is member of technical committees in ICMR, NACO and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. He was Steering Committee Member of 12<sup>th</sup> Five Year Plan on Health of Planning Commission of India.

Dr. Yesudian has published 4 books and about 30 journal articles.
