Capacity Development:

Training programmes were organized by DHFWS, Dhalai to develop capacity of Cold Chain Handlers.

Evidence of effectiveness:

The initiative has been beneficial for all Children as they have received all vaccines on due time during COVID-19 pandemic too. The Full Immunization status during 2019-20 and during Implementation period (April-Sep 2020).

Financial Implication:

The Financial Involvement for upgradation of MCH and CCP is made from Rogi Kalyan Samity/ Kayakaip Fund of respective Health Facilities.

Challenges:

Persistent efforts in improving the quality of services under maternal and Child Health and trying to reach out to the remotest unreached areas and vulnerable sections of the community.



The initiative may have the potential to be scaled in the other parts of the States to improve the immunization coverage.
