**Subject: Approval of Proposals for FC-XV Grants for Health for FY 2022-23 for the State of Telangana – Regarding.**

Madam,

This is with reference to the proposals submitted by the Government of Telangana vide letter No. 106/PLG/NHM/2021 dated 25<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 regarding FC-XV Grants for Health for FY 2022-23 for an amount of Rs 419.20 Crores.

2. After appraisal, the National Level Committee approved the proposals of the FC-XV Health Grants for FY 2022-23 for the State of Telangana for an amount of Rs 419.19 Crores (against the proposals amounting to Rs 419.20 Crores) subject to the conditions mentioned in Para-3 below. Thus, approval of the competent authority is hereby conveyed to the State of Telangana for an amount of Rs 419.19 Crores under FC-XV for FY 2022-23 as given in Table-1.

The detailed proposal and approval for FC-XV grants to Health for FY 2022-23 are given at **Annexure-I**.

3. The approval is subject to the following conditions:

(a) Fund Utilization

- i. All the approved activities are to be completed in a time bound manner.
- ii. The State must ensure that the funds approved under XV-FC are used ONLY for the approved activities and according to the guidelines.
- iii. All the conditionalities outlined under the Technical and Operational Guidelines dated 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2021, Operational Guidelines for implementation of the recommendations of the FC-XV on Health Sector grants contained in Chapter 7 of FC-XV Final Report dated 16<sup>th</sup> July, 2021 issued by D/o Expenditure (DoE), DoE's Addendum dated 8<sup>th</sup> September, 2021, OM No. 15 (2) FC-XV/FCD/2020-25 dated 27.01.2022 are applicable to approvals.
- iv. The State must strictly comply to the Negative Lists, which is specified for each of the components in the Operational Guidelines. The State should not utilize the grants for the activities in the Negative Lists.
- v. DoE has concurred with the proposal of DoHFW by way of a special dispensation that the funds recommended by FC-XV to a State for support to Diagnostics Infrastructure for the primary healthcare facilities under Sub-Centre, PHC and UPHC may be transferred by the State Finance Department directly to the State Health Department or any other Department authorised by the State level Committee (SLC) for procurement under this component (vide Addendum dated 8<sup>th</sup> September, 2021). The States may take a note of the same. Further, the State Level committee (SLC) may decide about the procurement of any of the approved items of diagnostic infrastructure, medical equipment, Drugs etc involved in any of the components of the Health Sector Grant through a mechanism which may include centralised purchase (at State level) with the aim to ensure purchase of quality products at reasonable/competitive prices in an



efficient manner after following the due processes, procedures and practices (DOE OM No. 15 (2) FC-XV/FCD/2020-25 dated 27.01.2022).

- vi. The State should ensure that there is no duplication or overlap of proposals, tasks, procurements, constructions, hiring of HR, etc. for which funds have already been provided under NHM, State budgets, any other funds.

(b) Monitoring and reporting of progress

- vii. The State/SLC will send the progress reports on both physical and financial progress against the approved plan on quarterly basis to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India.
- viii. The State should regularly update the progress on the monthly basis in the NHM-PMS Portal for release of subsequent instalments of FC-XV grants to the State.
- ix. Necessary UCs and documents, as prescribed by DoE, have to be submitted by the State Government.

4. DoE has been requested to take further actions towards release of FC-XV Health Grants through Local Governments to your State vide letter No. 7 (20)/2020-NHM I dated 30<sup>th</sup> August, 2022 (copy enclosed).

5. The conditions mentioned supra, would need to be meticulously adhered to by the State Government.
